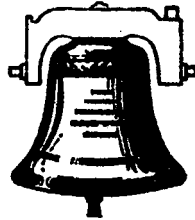

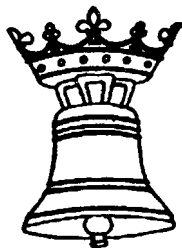

OBJECTS

1. **FEDERATION.** To supply an organisation which shall unite the separate companies of Church Bell Ringers within the Diocese for the purpose of mutual support and encouragement in the performance of the duties of their office, and in the practice of their art.
2. **RECOGNITION.** To obtain full recognition of the ringers' office as essentially a branch of the Church's work; that ringers and their services (qualifications for which demand much time, skill and mental labour) may be placed upon a true and acknowledged basis.
3. **PROMOTION OF CHANGE RINGING.** To encourage, cultivate and foster the art of scientific Change Ringing by frequent meetings in various centres for practice or peal ringing; and to provide, as far as possible, instructors when and where required.
4. **REFORM.** To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof; as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

CONSTITUTION

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
2. The Officers of the Guild shall consist of: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese as President, Patrons, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Masters, Secretary and Treasurer, Auditor and the Technical Adviser.

3. The Guild shall consist of (a) Ringing Members, (b) Probationers, (c) Junior Members, (d) Honorary Members, (e) Life Members.
 - (a) Ringing Members may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present; or, provisionally by two other Members, before starting for a peal. Ringing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Ringing Members shall be 50p per year. Ringing Members, on attaining the age of 70 years shall become Honorary Life Members.
 - (b) Probationers may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present. This grade of membership is for those learning change ringing but who have not yet rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Probationers shall be 25p per year.
 - (c) Junior Members under the age of 16 years, who shall pay half the annual subscription.
 - (d) Honorary Members may be elected on a payment of 50p per year.
 - (e) Life Members residing out of the County to make a single payment of £1.
4. The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Masters, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Technical Adviser, Pearson Handbells Trustees, District Chairmen (ex-officio), District Secretaries (ex-officio), together with two elected members from each District, seven to form a quorum. The Committee will meet a minimum of three times during the year.
5. The area covered by the Guild shall be divided into Districts, each of which shall have its own Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Committee, who shall be elected at the District Annual Meeting. Each District will elect two representatives to serve on the Guild Committee. The Secretary will:
 - (a) Arrange Meetings for practice.
 - (b) Arrange for instruction.
 - (c) Collect the subscriptions of all members.

N.B. — In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary, or Captain, or Ringing Master, who shall collect all subscriptions, as soon as possible after January 1st and send them to the District Secretary.
 - (d) Forward these subscriptions to the General Secretary together with his receipt book and details of any expenditure, at the end of the year for audit.
6. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

RULES

1. Subscriptions shall be due in advance on January 1st annually.
2. Any member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st shall lose his membership. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid. Lapsed members may be reinstated on payment of 10p in addition to the annual subscription.
3. Should a Ringing Member, having paid five consecutive years subscriptions, remove from the Diocese, he may without payment become a Non-Resident Member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.
4. All ringing at meetings of the Guild shall be under the direction of a Ringing Master and shall be such as is approved by the Central Council. The decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.
5. A peal fee of 10p per rope is payable in respect of all peals rung for the Guild. Conductors are responsible for collecting and forwarding them to the General Secretary. No peal will be recorded unless the peal fees have been paid.
6. The Secretary may pay, on request, 2nd class return railway fare, together with a maximum of two nights' hotel expenses to such representative attending the Central Council Meeting, provided that the total indebtedness of the Guild for all representatives does not exceed £20 in any one year.
7. The Committee may remove a member from the Guild for a serious offence against the Objects and Rules, subject to appeal at a General Meeting.
8. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three months' notice given at a General Meeting.

REGULATIONS relating to PEARSON'S HANDBELLS

1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of both the Trustees.

4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the Committee.
7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

STRIKING COMPETITION RULES

1. The competition shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date as shall be decided by the committee.
2. All bona fide members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. No member may ring in more than one piece.
4. A band competing as a representative band of a particular tower must have at least 4 members shown in the annual report as members of that tower, or who are bona fide Sunday service ringers at that tower.
5. Each band must have a representative present at the draw, the time of the draw to be advertised in *The Ringing World*.
6. Two minutes round ringing and stand will be allowed for practice before the test piece.
7. The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method. In the event of a team ringing Doubles a cover bell must be used. The length of the test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
8. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to teams meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
9. Three judges, appointed by the committee, will be present. Their decision is final.
10. The Mitson Shield is, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for its location, safe keeping, etc.

GENERAL SECRETARY AND TREASURER'S REPORT

The fiftieth anniversary year proved to be a landmark in the Guild's history in several respects. I have no doubt that not a single reader of the Ringing World can have been unaware of what has gone on, and what is going on, in Suffolk ringing circles. The enthusiasm shown, not simply by a handful, for ringing a quarter peal in every ringable tower in the County, for attending the A.G.M. or the Dinner, and for all kinds of service/peal ringing during the year has amply rewarded the planning and forethought which your Officers and committee gave to the celebration of this year. During the year there was an overall increase of 35 on the revised membership figure for 1972. Sadly, we have lost a large number of our older members through death this year. It is all the more to the credit of instructors and District Officers that the increase in membership should have been so large.

Meetings

The A.G.M. at Debenham was very well attended. The Bishop of Dunwich, one of our Vice-Presidents, gave the address at the service, and tea was taken at the Modern School. At the business meeting Ranald Clouston was elected a Vice-President, as a token of the Guild's appreciation of his painstaking service as Technical Adviser over 16 years. Leonard Last and Hubert Mitson, who together with George Pipe retired as Handbell Trustees, have served the Guild in a variety of offices over the years, and we thank them for their work.

The Striking Competition was held at Offton, attracted a record entry, and after a sumptuous tea the Shield changed hands again, being awarded by the judges to Horringer.

A General Meeting was held at Elveden in October to further consider the proposal that the more elderly members of the Guild should not be required to pay annual subscriptions. The motion passed, and now incorporated in the Constitution said "that Ringing Members, on attaining the age of 70 years, shall become Honorary Life Members". In reply to a question which has been frequently raised with your Officers since that meeting, I should explain that this does not preclude any member who so wishes from continuing to contribute annually to Guild funds.

The committee has met four times during the year, the attendance averaging seventeen. The 'White Paper', produced by a small group of enthusiastic members, containing ideas on 'positive ways of injecting new life and enthusiasm into the Guild', has resulted in the formation of sub-committees to work on education and training, the upkeep of bells in unmanned towers, service ringing, finance, information and bells in redundant churches. The emphasis in all these committees is self-help. As ringers, we cannot expect ringing conditions and new learner ringers to improve themselves. We must see what wants doing and put our backs into doing it. Of such endeavours it is true that 'God helps those who help themselves'.

Finance

The accounts show that our funds are in a healthy state. It is extremely pleasing to be able to report that the Restoration Fund is now a four figure sum. During the year two grants were paid out - to Nayland and Henley. A further £345 of the fund is promised on the satisfactory completion of proposed restorations. We note with gratitude that the splendid efforts of Leslie Mills to make the ringing exhibition at Long Melford such a success also resulted in swelling the Restoration Fund by £95.

Central Council

Your three representatives all attended the meeting at Oxford. As the Ringing World report of this year's meeting indicated, the Council is grappling with the problems raised by increasing numbers of redundant bells, and of helping affiliated Guilds and Associations to cope with situations arising in their own territories.

My personal thanks to all District Officers and members of the Executive committee, for whom 1973 has been a taxing year. I hope that 1974 will show the fruits of the hard work put in during this anniversary year.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

Our fiftieth anniversary year was spent in such a way that 1973 will go down in the history of the Guild as one of our most successful years ever. The opportunity which such an occasion presents was firmly grasped by all members, and my report can only touch on the highlights of a year packed with activities.

This year no less than 301 quarter peals were rung. As part of the special effort to ring a quarter on every ringable tower, 162 towers were quarter-pealed. The first two months of the year were extremely busy in this respect, and when the special Guild issue of the Ringing World was published in early April over 150 quarters were published in that issue.

The peal total for the year (178) was the second highest in the history of the Guild. Nearly all the peals were rung by resident members, whilst the record total of 186 in 1970 included a peal tour of 12 peals. Our own Guild Peal Week gave many members the opportunity to ring a peal and 16 members rang their first peal in 1973. My congratulations go to Glenys R. Atkinson, Christine Earle, Janice R. Langley, Charles H. Ablitt, James L. Bunn, Stephen J. Christian, Rodney G. Eastall, Ross J. Finbow, Peter S. Franks, Philip R. Jeffries, Alan P. Mayle, Trevor Rawlings, Brian M. Salter, Paul V. Stannard, Jack Thurlow and David L. Williams. The following members rang their first handbell peal: Patricia M. Bailey, E. Frank Gilbert, Roger Peters and Sam Twitchett.

Particularly noteworthy in the peal columns was Stephen Pettman's achievement of ringing 101 peals for the Guild in 1973. He is the first person ever to do this. Many other ringers achieved their highest personal peal total in any one year, and two who did so also had important anniversaries to celebrate: Ernest G.B Pearce rang a peal on the 40th anniversary of his first peal, and Leslie G. Brett rang a peal on the 50th anniversary of his. My congratulations to these two. May they continue to ring peals for many years to come. Some towers appeared in the peal columns for the first time, or after a long break; Sweffling, Gt. Barton, Lt. Glemham and S. Elmham St. Margaret. Two peals were rung at Hadleigh and were no doubt earned. Roger Whittell has now pealed all the ringable towers in Ipswich; and Grundisburgh, our leading peal tower for many years, has now passed the 300 mark. The four peals in a day on June 23rd was another first for the Guild, and Gordon Leach's first peal after a 40 year break was another noteworthy effort.

With all the peal and quarter-peal ringing going on, it seemed unlikely that members would have much energy to carry on the more mundane aspects of ringing. This was certainly not so. An excellently supported A.G.M. at Debenham, and a large crowd at the Striking Contest held at Offton (won this year by Horringer) were only the build-up to two very full days at Long Melford when Guild members demonstrated ringing on the Expo bells to an appreciative general public.

Teaching and Sunday service ringing have also occupied the time and talents of Officers and members. The S.W. District continues to produce a stream of learners and it is very pleasing to learn that Long Melford bells are being rung regularly again. Another one of our major towers which has got a new band is Debenham, where a band is being trained under the auspices of the Debenham Adult Evening Classes. Sunday service ringing is a little more difficult to judge, but it appears that a good proportion of our bells are rung on Sundays and your officers are looking into the whole problem of service ringing with particular reference to organising 'circuits', so spreading the talents of the available ringers.

A memorable year. May I thank all those who have worked so hard to make it so. My thanks also go to all members who have given my wife and I such a warm welcome as we have travelled around the County. I am sure that 1973 has helped put Suffolk back in it's rightful place as a leader of the Exercise. May we keep it so in the years to come.

TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

1973 has been an eventful year for your Technical Adviser, he much appreciated the honour of being elected a Vice-President at the Annual General Meeting.

The bells at Great Barton, East Bergholt, and Henley have all been rehung. At Great Barton the new frame support structure of one set of steel joists is different from the two sets of steel joists set at right angles covered by the specification and the faculty application approved by the Chancellor. The frame distorts horizontally in the centre as the bells swing, and your Adviser has suggested that an anchor be fitted to the tower wall to stop this movement. A suitable anchor is to be fitted in the near future.

At East Bergholt the fourth bell was found to be cracked in the crown, this damage has been repaired by welding and all five bells have been rehung in ball bearings in the restored bell cage.

At Henley the bells have been rehung in ball bearings with new clapper joints and pulleys, the frame has been well painted and a new floor laid under it. Much of the work up the tower has been done by the local band under the leadership of Howard Egglestone and they are to be congratulated on a fine job which has reduced the financial burden on the parish considerably. This arrangement could well be followed elsewhere when bells need rehanging in a sound frame.

At Sproughton your Adviser met some of the members of the Maintenance Subcommittee to discuss routine maintenance of rings with fittings of some age. He found that a full overhaul is really necessary as only patch-up work has been carried out on individual bells since 1813. However short term work will be beneficial, he listed this and gave a scheme for a long term restoration to rehang the bells in a new frame set lower in the tower on a reinforced concrete girdle.

At Hartest the bells were rehung in a new metal frame, with the present third bell recast in 1953, and in 1963 a new treble, the gift of one of our Vice-Presidents, Arthur Rolfe, was added. They remain in good order.

At Tuddenham St. Mary by Mildenhall the five bells are quite unfit to ring in changes and are unsafely clocked. Your Adviser recommended fitting Ellacombe type chiming hammers in the short term to prevent the bells becoming cracked, and then rehanging in a new frame set lower in the tower as soon as funds permit.

At Preston the six bells were rehung by Alfred Bowell in 1932. The frame is set up on a 6ft high timber table set on corbels in the ringing chamber. As the bells swing and with the various tie rods tight there is more top cill frame movement horizontally than there should be; however the bells remain quite easy to ring. In the longer term it would be better to mount the frame lower and dispense with the table; the ringers could then be accommodated on a gallery.

At Euston the tower is tall and thin with the bells at the top. The five bells were last rehung in 1909 in a frame of about 1701. This distorts as the bells swing, the main bearings are worn, and the tower has a vertical crack by the tenor. The present arrangement does not permit the satisfactory addition of a new treble, and the writer recommended a new two tier frame set lower down with a new dead space between the bells and the ringers on the first floor.

At Walsham-le-Willows the elm headstocks are wormeaten and the writer treated them with anti-woodworm fluid. The main bearings are only slightly worn and the bells are quite easy to ring. Your Adviser has yet to make a full inspection, but he has listed some of the short term items of work which would improve the going order and which could be done by local labour.

At Market Weston the writer had reported in 1959 on the rotten frame timber and support beams by the east wall caused by rainwater. The five bells have been rung in changes recently but your Adviser found that the frame and its support structure is only precariously supported by the east wall and nothing had been done to deal with this problem since his earlier visit. Unfortunately some of the side frame inclined members' joints with the frame bottom cills have rotted away and one bearing on the third bell has dropped relative to the other so even with a new support girder under the frame there is only a 50-50 chance that the frame could be made sufficiently rigid. In the long term a new frame is vital. Such a pity, as the present one was more than half renewed in 1898 and has a pit for a new treble. All the damage is due to blocked rainwater pipes.

At Brandeston the third bell's cast iron headstock became cracked in the centre. Your Adviser visited, and subsequently members of the Guild removed the broken headstock for return to the bell foundry and will fit a new one when it becomes available. Our thanks are due to them for this work.

At Parham the timber bell frame of about 1350, one of the oldest in the diocese, is to be preserved; two of the three bells also date from this period. All three are to be hung from deadstocks secured to steel girders set into the tower walls just above the top cill of the old frame. The steelwork is to be designed to permit the bells to be swung chimed at a later date if required.

At St. Mary's Bury the high cost of restoring the tower to stand the quite heavy ring of eight being swung in full circles has caused the PCC to decide to have the bells hung stationary in the old frame. This is a great pity, but as the work on the tower was thought to cost about £20,000 at present day rates one can understand their feelings.

It is hoped that at South Elmham St. Margaret and Hawkedon work will be done to enable the bells to be rung again.

The problem of Redundant Churches is much before us. Fortunately in Suffolk most of ours are of some architectural merit and most have so far gone to the Redundant Churches Fund for care and maintenance, and this should include their bells and other fittings. However we have got the unfortunate situations at Beccles and Newton Green where parts of the fabric are declared redundant, the detached tower with its ring of ten at the former, and the tower, nave, porch and unringable set of five bells at the latter. Your Adviser feels that the Pastoral Measure is being misused by such proposals, and he hopes that the legislation will soon be strengthened to prevent this sort of problem arising in the future. In the case of Beccles your Adviser has been in touch with the Diocesan Secretary and the Church Commissioners to see that a legal right to ring the bells when required is retained by the church authorities.

The church of St. Mary-at-Quay, Ipswich has gone to the Redundant Churches Fund for care and maintenance, and Sudbury St. Peter has been officially declared redundant. Those who visited the Richard III Exhibition in the summer at the National Portrait Gallery, London, may have seen the writer's plaster cast of the full inscription on the fine tenor of c1470 at Sudbury St. Peter.

Your Adviser visited Troston and met the PCC to discuss rehanging the six bells. Finance is the problem, linked with the fear of what the future holds for a small parish with a total population of only some 220. Mr. Brand who lives in the parish is a change ringer and we must support him in his efforts to get this light six going again.

Following the setting up of the Bell Maintenance Sub-Committee your Adviser wrote up an eight page booklet on Belfry Care and Maintenance for issuing to the districts. He will be pleased to make up further copies for those who would like to help on this work.

1973 saw the lamented death of Frederick Bowell, he called the writer's first 720 back in 1944. Fortunately George Pipe managed to recover various papers relating to the Ipswich Bell Foundry and your Adviser is now in the process of making a detailed examination of them. The firm worked far and wide and it is to be hoped that an article will appear in due course on their activities.

On the tricentenary of the death of Rev. Richard Duckworth of Hartest your Adviser reviewed the evidence to connect him with the Tintinnalugia in the Ringing World (page 216). He was clearly interested in bells but his connection with that standard work has yet to be proved.

With the recent violent inflation it is clear that in 1974 and future years we must do more bell maintenance and overhaul work ourselves. Alas petrol will be more expensive and one can only hope that it will be available. As a Guild we must do all we can to ensure that decay, woodworm attacks on headstocks and wheels, leaking roofs, etc. are dealt with with the minimum of delay.

OBITUARIES

James Bennett - Grundisburgh

As a Royal Marine, he travelled the four corners of the earth and in his day, as a member of Bill Pye's famous band, he was a very well-known performer. Jim, a 1000-pealer, member of the 15,312 Cambridge Maximus peal band in 1929, a Cumberland and a strong churchman was above all a disciplinarian, not least to himself, in all that he undertook.

Frederick Bowell - Ipswich

The talented, though somewhat eccentric, son of Alfred Bowell the Ipswich Bellfounder, Fred's lifelong interest was in teaching beginners. An able musician, and a member of the Guild since its formation, it was always regretted that he was unable to carry on his father's successful business.

Edward E. Davey - Wetherden and Clacton

Although living most of his life in Essex, Ted was very much part of the Suffolk scene and his genial personality will be missed. A capable ringer, especially on the heavy end, he rang many peals for the Guild.

Arthur Grimwood - Stowmarket

Between the wars, with Harry Lister and Garnham Blaxcell, he formed the nucleus of the Stowmarket company who specialised in peals of Treble Bob, Double Norwich and Superlative. "Docker" Grimwood was a good tenor-man and rang several peals of over 6,000 changes.

J. Reginald Heath - Newmarket

Reggie was best known, perhaps, for his handbell ringing ability, but he also helped the Art in the far corner of West Suffolk. A happy and busy little man, we shall miss his presence at our gatherings.

James Horrocks - Felsham

Like many another countryman, Jim Horrocks was a faithful Sunday service ringer in the Felsham area, when bells were very much part of village life.

Harry Jarvis - Leiston

In his younger days a ringer at Yoxford and district, encouraged in his Art, like so many in this area, by the redoubtable Fred Lambert of Halesworth. He died in June at Leiston.

Harry D. Lister - Stowmarket

The main conductor of the Stowmarket band, Harry had rung about 300 peals up to Cambridge Maximus. His speciality was Double Norwich and Treble Ten and as a founder member of the Guild he did much in the central area of the Diocese. Sad, too, that he died within a few weeks of his boyhood friend, Ted Davey.

Derek Lockwood - Thorndon

A farmer who in his day rang at Wetheringsett, Stradbroke and Fressingfield as well as Thorndon, Derek passed away at Eye in November.

Miss Grace Reeve - Hockwold

As Chaucer would have said, "A kind and gentle maid" who with her sister Dora supported the work of the Guild in the more remote areas of N.W. Suffolk, She will be sadly missed.

James Smy - Blaxhall

Another countryman from the village and band of ringers immortalised by George Ewart Evans in 'Ask the Fellows who cut the Hay'. Jim Smy was a faithful service, and occasional peal-, ringer.

Charles J. Sedgley - Ipswich

One of the best-known figures in the Exercise, conductor, composer and in his prime, between the Wars, one of the foremost twelve-bell authorities. With George Symonds he built up a Surprise Maximus band without peer at St. Mary-le-Tower and helped give the Suffolk Guild its reputation in the Exercise. He served as Master from the Guild's foundation in 1923 until 1956, and rang 357 peals, 130 on twelve. A self-taught man in many fields, he was a splendid companion and we shall find his place hard to fill.

Henry Vince - Marlesford

P.C. Harry Vince, the village 'bobby', a man of humble ringing achievements, but nevertheless one who enjoyed his ringing and was a gentleman with it. He long declared the quality of Lt. Glemham bells!

May these past members and friends rest in peace, and the Suffolk Guild offers its sympathy to the bereaved.
