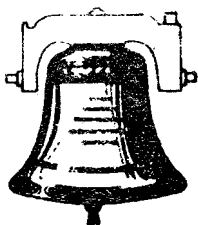

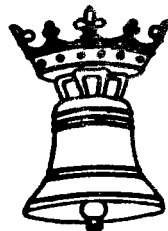

### OBJECTS

"The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:-

1. To promote and encourage the practice of bell-ringing.
2. To recruit, train and encourage bell-ringers in the practice of their art.
3. To cultivate the art of scientific change ringing.
4. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof; as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

### CONSTITUTION

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
2. The Officers of the Guild shall consist of: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese as President, Patrons, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Auditor and the Technical Adviser.
3. The Guild shall consist of (a) Ringing Members (b) Probationers, (c) Junior Members, (d) Honorary Members (e) Life Members.
  - (a) Ringing Members may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present; or provisionally by two other members, before starting for a peal. Ringing Members may be elected as soon as they have rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Ringing Members shall be £1.00 per year. Ringing Members, on attaining the age of 70 years shall become Honorary Life Members.
  - (b) Probationers may be elected at any meeting where there are five other members present. This grade of membership is for those learning change ringing but who have not yet rung 120 changes on a tower bell or on two handbells retained in hand. The subscription of Probationers shall be 50p per year.
  - (c) Junior Members under the age of 16 years, who shall pay half the annual subscription.
  - (d) Honorary Members may be elected on a payment of £1.00 per year.
  - (e) Life Members residing out of the County to make a single payment of £1.00.
4. The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer, Report Editor, Librarian, Technical Adviser, Pearson Handbells Trustees, District Chairman (ex-officio), District Secretaries (ex-officio), together with two elected numbers from each District, seven to form a quorum. The Committee will meet a minimum of three times during the year.

5. The area covered by the Guild shall be divided into Districts, each of which shall have its own Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Committee, who shall be elected at the District Annual Meeting. Each District will elect two representatives to serve on the Guild Committee. The Secretary will:
  - (a) Arrange Meetings for practice.
  - (b) Arrange for instruction.
  - (c) Collect the subscriptions of all members.  
N.B. In each company there shall be chosen a Secretary, or Captain, or Ringing Master, who shall collect all subscriptions, as soon as possible after January 1st and send them to the District Secretary.
  - (d) Forward these subscriptions to the General Secretary together with his receipt book and details of any expenditure, at the end of the year for audit.
6. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
7. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 day's notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Society ceasing to be a charity in law.
8. In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar objects to the Guild.

#### RULES

1. Subscriptions shall be due in advance on January 1st annually.
2. Any member whose subscription is unpaid on December 31st shall lose his membership. No peal shall be recorded unless the subscriptions of all taking part in it are paid. Lapsed members may be reinstated on payment of 10p in addition to the annual subscription.
3. Should a Ringing Member, having paid five consecutive years subscriptions remove from the Diocese, he may without payment become a Non-Resident Member for such time as he continues to reside outside the Diocese.
4. All Ringing at meetings of the Guild shall be under the direction of a Ringing Master and shall be such as is approved by the Central Council. The decisions of the Central Council shall be recognised in recording any ringing performances.
5. A peal fee of 10p per rope is payable in respect of all peals rung for the Guild. Conductors are responsible for collecting and forwarding them to the General Secretary. No peal will be recorded unless the peal fees have been paid.
6. The Secretary may pay, on request, 2nd class return railway fare, together with a maximum of two night's hotel expenses to such representatives attending the Central Council Meeting, provided that the total indebtedness of the Guild for all representatives does not exceed £20 in any one year.



7. The Committee may remove a member from the Guild for a serious offence against the Objects and Rules, subject to appeal at a General Meeting.
8. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three month's notice given at a General meeting.

## OBJECTS

The Guild shall be established for the promotion of ringing for Divine Service and in furtherance of this object:

1. To promote and encourage the practice of bell-ringing.
2. To recruit, train and encourage bell-ringers in the practice of their art.
3. To cultivate the art of scientific change ringing.
4. To promote a proper appreciation of the ringing chamber as a part of God's House; to encourage the bestowal of care and attention on the cleanliness and proper equipment thereof, as well as the preservation of the bells in an efficient condition; to advocate needful repairs and renovations and to supply, when required, reliable information and advice of a practical character concerning the condition of bells and their fittings.

## CONSTITUTION

### A. Name

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1a. It shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and registered as a Charity at Law. (Ref. No.266669)
- 1b. The President shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and Vice Presidents shall be elected at the A.G.M. of the Guild.

### B. Membership

2. Membership shall consist of the following categories:
  - (a) Ringing Members. A person who can ring rounds efficiently on a tower bell.
  - (b) Associate Members. A person who wishes to support the Guild.
  - (c) Life Honorary Member. ... Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
  - (d) Non-resident Life Members. A person who is qualified to be a Ringing Member, or Associate Member but who resides outside the territory of the Guild and who is not a member under either 2a, 2b or 2c.

3. Ringing, and Life Honorary Members only shall have voting rights and be permitted to hold Office in the Guild.
4. Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation.
- C. Districts
5. There shall be four districts:
  1. North East District consisting of the deaneries of Beccles and South Elmham, Halesworth, Hartismere, Hoxne and Saxmundham.
  2. North West District, consisting of the deaneries of Ixworth, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Thingoe.
  3. South East District consisting of the deaneries of Bosmere, Colneys, Ipswich, Loes, Samford and Woodbridge.
  4. South West District consisting of the deaneries of Clare, Hadleigh, Lavenham, and Sudbury.
- D. Government
6. The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as shall be decided by the Guild Management Committee and shall be the ultimate decision making body of the Guild. It shall elect Guild Officers and set subscriptions and fees for the following year.
7. Members shall be elected to fill the following Offices:

Chairman: Ringing Master: Secretary: Treasurer: Maintenance Officer: Report Editor: Newsletter Editor: C.C. Representatives: Technical Adviser: Librarian and two Handbell Trustees.
8. In order that the Guild be run efficiently and it's Objects implemented there shall be three Committees established with the following responsibilities:
  - (a) The Guild Management Committee which shall co-ordinate all Guild activities; publish a printed Annual Report and audited Accounts and convene Sub-Committees as may from time to time be required, and shall recommend the levels of subscriptions and peal fees and other methods of raising money and shall organise general meetings and social activities.
  - (b) Recruitment and Training Committee which shall prepare training programmes for use in the Districts; provide courses for the training of Teachers of ringing and assist Districts in the recruitment of Ringers.

- (c) Restoration and Maintenance Committee which shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese; which shall make recommendations concerning the preservation and use of bells from redundant Churches; which shall advise incumbents and arrange such local restoration and maintenance work as may be necessary.

E. Finance

9. All money in the Guild's General Fund not required for normal working purposes shall be deposited by the Treasurer in such investments as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee.
10. All money in the Restoration Fund and the Jubilee Fund shall be invested by the Treasurer as may be directed by the Guild Management Committee. Grants for restoration work shall be made by the Guild Management Committee. Such grants shall only finally be made following approval of the Guild Ringing Master and Technical Adviser.
- 10a. One half of the subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members together with one half of all peal fees shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.
11. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Secretary or the Treasurer but any cheque greater in value than the limit set annually by the Guild Management Committee must have the prior approval of that Committee.

F. Records and Handbells

12. The Report Editor shall record all peals rung for the Guild and quarter peals rung in the Diocese and publish them in the Annual Report.
13. The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild.
14. The Handbell Trustees shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make such recommendations as may be necessary for the repair of the handbells to the Guild Management Committee.

G. General

15. The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
16. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of the members present at an Annual or Special General Meeting provided that 14 day's notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members and provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any amendment which shall have the effect of the Society ceasing to be a Charity in Law.

17. In the event of dissolution of the Guild any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar objects to the Guild.

## RULES

### Guild Rules

#### A. Election of Members and Subscriptions

1. Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded. Membership shall be exercised through only one District at a time, being the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter in advance on the first day of January each year. Membership shall cease if such subscriptions are not paid within one year of becoming due. The subscription of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the next year.
2. The subscription rates for members shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and unless a change is agreed the existing rate shall continue. Full time Students shall pay not less than half of the full rate and subscription shall be waived for members over the age of 70.
3. Life Honorary Members shall only be elected at an Annual General Meeting and nominations may only be made by the Guild Management Committee or a District. No further subscription is payable after election.
4. Persons who have been Ringing or Associate Members for at least two years may, upon leaving the Diocese, inform their District Secretary that they wish to become Non-resident Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence. A person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-resident Member as an alternative to Ringing or Associate Membership. A single payment of £1.00 shall be made at the time of election.
5. For the purposes of peal ringing new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry to the appropriate category of membership subject to the confirmation at a business meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the Guild Management Committee in the case of a Non-resident Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.

6. Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the Guild Management Committee which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.
7. The Objects, Constitution and Rules can only be altered by a General Meeting after three month's notice given at a General Meeting.

B. Election of Officers

8. All Officers shall retire annually at the Guild's Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election. Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the Annual General Meeting provided always that they proposed and seconded. If more than one nomination for any Office is received then election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote. C.C. Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Central Council during the second year of the triennium at the A.G.M. of the Guild.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Auditor who is not a member of the Guild Management Committee and need not be a member of the Guild.

C. Committee Structure

10. The Guild Management Committee shall consist of:  
Vice Presidents, Guild Officers as listed under paragraph 7 of the Constitution, two Representatives from each District and two Representatives from each of the other Committees listed under paragraph 8 of the Constitution. Nine members shall constitute a quorum. This Committee shall meet at least three times per year. The Chairman shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Guild and the Guild Management Committee. In his absence the Chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his absence by a person elected by the meeting.
11. The Recruitment and Training Committee shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two Representatives from each District.
12. The Restoration and Maintenance Committee shall consist of the Guild Maintenance Officer as Convenor, the Guild Technical Advisor and two Representatives from each District.
13. Each of the above two Committees shall meet at least three times a year. At a meeting which shall be held in January they shall elect their two Representatives on the Guild Management Committee.

14. The Chairman, Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Maintenance Officer shall form the Guild Executive. In the event of a Guild Office being vacated between A.G.M.'s they shall make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened.
- D. Expenses
15. The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- (a) The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the Guild Management Committee.
  - (b) The expenses of Guild Meetings.
  - (c) Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
  - (d) Insurance of Guild property.
  - (e) Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives expenses in attending each Council Meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the Guild Management Committee.
- E. Peal Records
16. All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
17. Conductors shall forward the following to the Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- (a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-resident Members elected in the belfry.
  - (b) The appropriate peal fees.
  - (c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above.
- Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.
- F. Alteration of Rules
18. No alteration or addition shall be made to the Rules of the Guild except as specified in paragraphs 16 and 17 of the Constitution.

### District Rules

19. Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the previous year, electing Officers and arranging activities for the coming year. Members shall be eligible to vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
20. The following Officers shall be elected annually:  
  
Chairman: Ringing Master: Secretary/Treasurer: District Maintenance Officer: Newsletter Correspondent.  
  
The Chairman, Ringing Master, and District Maintenance Officer shall normally represent the District on the Guild Management, Recruitment and Training, and Restoration and Maintenance Committees respectively but substitutes may be permitted. One other Representative to each of the Guild Committees shall be elected. The District Officers and one elected member from each deanery shall form the District Committee. A District may elect additional working Officers at it's discretion to assist the running of the District.
21. The District Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all subscriptions and other monies due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer. A statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January. A directory of tower correspondents, lists of members and ringing times shall be submitted to the Secretary by 15th January.
22. The District Maintenance Officer shall endeavour to arrange for the inspection of every belfry in the District at least once a year and shall report his findings to the Restoration and Maintenance Committee at their January meeting. He shall be available to advise incumbents and shall provide leadership of local working parties where necessary.
23. The District Newsletter Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Newsletter, the Ringing World and the local newspaper.
24. The District Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the District Annual Meeting on the year's work.

### REGULATIONS relating to the PEARSON'S HANDBELLS

1. The Pearson Handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustees. They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.



2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustees by the borrower, and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustees if they are required by another member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceeding borrower.
3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustees by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of both of the Trustees.
4. The bells must be returned to the Trustees upon request. The Trustees should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
6. The Trustees are responsible to the Committee of the Guild for the administration of the bells, and their decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by the Committee.
7. The Trustees and the Committee of the Guild would be grateful for financial help for the maintenance of the handbells from members who have enjoyed the use of them.

#### MITSON SHIELD STRIKING COMPETITION RULES

1. The competition shall take place on the third Saturday in May or on any other date as shall be decided by the Committee.
2. All bona fide members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. No member may ring in more than one piece.
4. A band competing as a representative band of a particular tower must have at least four members shown in the Annual Report as members of that tower, or who are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers at that tower.
5. The Mitson Shield can only be held by a band as defined in rule 4 of the Mitson Shield Striking Competition Rules.

6. Each band must have a representative present at the draw, the time of the draw to be advertised in the Ringing World.
7. Two minutes round ringing and stand will be allowed for practice before the test piece.
8. The test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor method. In the event of a team ringing Doubles a cover bell must be used. The length of the test piece may be shortened at the discretion of the Ringing Master in the event of a large entry.
9. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available to teams meeting short, at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
10. Three Judges, appointed by the Committee, will be present. Their decision is final.
11. The Mitson Shield is, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time given directions for it's location, safe keeping, etc.

#### INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF TOWERS

The following table is used to show the condition of the ring:

- 10 - Excellent, Ball bearings, modern frame and fittings.
- 9 - Excellent. Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings - or ball bearings in an old frame.
- 8 - Good going order.
- 7 - Fair going order.
- 6 - Poor going order.
- 5 - Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided.
- 4 - Ringable with difficulty and a degree of risk after making odd repairs.
- 3 - Unringable mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position.
- 2 - Unringable mainly because of frame and/or fittings.
- 1 - Hung dead.
- 0 - Some bells unhung and on the ground.

While every effort has been made to ensure that the information given is accurate, the Technical Adviser would be very pleased to hear of any corrections.

### Maintenance Work

#### South East District - EASTON

Alan Leach and his helpers have cleaned out the belfry, tightened up frame and headstock belts and cleaned out the bearings. Two of the bearing covers were broken and required brazing and two new pins were made and fitted.

#### North East District - RENDHAM

Mr. R. Peters, B. Sedge, J. Powter and others have been instrumental in getting this tower ringable again after 25 years by cleaning the belfry, tightening nuts and belts and lubricating. The culmination of their efforts was the rehanging of the tenor on a new headstock. Apart from making the headstock, a frame had also to be made to support the bell. Five people were involved in the rehanging of the bell and this splendid effort is an example of what can be done.

#### South West District - STRADISHALL

Mr D Kiddy has made and fitted a set of rope guides about twelve feet from the ground and this has made the handling of these five bells easier.

#### GREAT THURLOW

Mr W Perry made and fitted a new ash stay to the second bell, re-secured netting over the louvres to keep out the birds, lubricated pulleys and adjusted ropes to limit the garter hole wear.

#### SUDBURY, ST. PETER

Parts of the clock mechanism which control the four clock faces together with the quarter and hour hammers were removed by W. Perry to facilitate the lowering of the bells. The clock mechanism was replaced afterwards.

### TECHNICAL ADVISER'S REPORT

Jubilee year was a good one for bell restorations; the list includes the Cathedral at Bury St Edmunds, Hadleigh, Stratford St. Mary, and Earl Soham.

At the Cathedral the bells were rededicated and are in regular use even though the restoration of the tower structure is still in hand. The accoustics inside the ringing chamber are not as good as they could be as the trebles are a little difficult to hear, the writer has made proposals to the Department of the Enviroment but these have not yet been implemented. The new clappers in the two tenors broke after some months of use and the same problem arose with the new clappers in the two tenors at St. Mary-le-Tower, Ipswich. All four were dealt with by John Taylor & Co under guarantee.

At Hadleigh the bells were rededicated after being rehung in a new metal frame. The accoustics outside and in are much improved, and the tower structure is now moving as one and only slightly as the bells are rung. As installed the fourth was odd struck and the tenor's lip on one side was too near the metal side frame; these defects were corrected.

At Stratford St Mary the Whitechapel Foundry rehung the six bells in the old frame and the supporting structure was stiffened up. The result is a considerable improvement in the 'go' of the bells and Mr Charles Ablitt and his helpers are to be congratulated on the work they undertook in this restoration.

At Earl Soham though the bells were rededicated there have been a number of problems including the frame support arrangements and two bells hung on the skew in their pits. A sound deadening floor was to be erected when the writer last visited in October.

At Stoke by Nayland your Adviser visited with the church architect and found that the brickwork into which the frame support girders were set is not bonded with the main tower wall behind. This accounted for the movement noted and plans have now been made to bond the girders and the main brickwork together.

At Pakenham we are not allowed to ring due to the state of the tower structure. Your Adviser overhauled the Ellacombe type chiming system for the parish to use in the meantime.

At Sudbury St. Gregory it is hoped to repair the tower in 1978 and the writer inspected the eight bells. All appears in quite reasonable order though the mild steel frame is very rusty. The tenor is being clocked unsafely and he suggested fitting a chiming hammer.

At Lakenheath the six bells remain in quite good order, some minor items of repair were noted for attention.

At Saxmundham there are pits for two trebles, and your Adviser visited to obtain the particulars needed for such bells. Here the north side frame required anchoring to the tower structure.

At Wickham Market the bells have been lowered to the ground for safe keeping while the lower part of the tower is strengthened. This area has been showing severe cracking and signs of distress. When the tower has been dealt with it is hoped to rehang the bells at a lower level in a new frame.

At Sudbury St. Peter the bells have been lowered and 1978 should see them rehung in a new frame and augmented to ten by the Whitechapel Foundry.

Rishangles church became redundant, and as it is intended to allow it to be converted for residential use it was necessary to find a new home for the three 15th Cerr Brasyer bells from the Norwich foundry. One thought was to move them to Felixstowe St. John but this was not possible, and a new home has now been found for them as the three tenors to a new ring of six for Newton Flotman just south of Norwich on the main Ipswich road.

At Boxford some restoration work has been done on the outside of the tower but very little inside and the bells remain unringable. Ringing has had to stop at Worlingham and Ipswich St. Clement due to the state of the towers.

At Tattingstone after months of looking the writer did discover an unwanted bell at the Whitechapel Foundry which would have done as a treble to make six. Unfortunately the parish did not take up the option in the time scale requested. The writer measured the change in width of the crack in the west wall of the tower as .001 ins with the bells being rung.

He visited St. Mary-le-Tower Ipswich to investigate the odd struck eleventh bell with a replacement clapper. It was found that the latter was eccentric in the bell.

At Lydgate the derelict five had been at the Loughborough Foundry for a number of years. The three tenors were cracked or badly damaged, the fourth being in two pieces. The two trebles are now to be rehung in the old frame and the broken bells scrapped.

At Kelsale the writer has been in correspondence with the parish and the church architect about getting the eight bells overhauled.

At Wangford the five bells are quite unringable. The frame is mounted on timber props from the first floor and is much older than the present tower of 1875.

At Cretingham your Adviser overhauled and swung each bell in a full circle but the cracked east wall requires attention before regular ringing can be arranged.

At Long Melford he measured the horizontal movement of the top of the timber bell frame relative to the walls with the bells being rung. The maximum reading obtained was 0.080 ins. This reassured the church architect.

So 1977 was a busy year for your Adviser, made rather more so by problems resulting from restorations undertaken by the Loughborough Bell Foundry. He hopes that the reorganisation there will improve the situation in 1978.

State aid for churches in use began to flow at the end of 1977. Many of our Suffolk Towers are exceptional by any standard and they should benefit from this aid over the years.

#### MAINTENANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

There is a very genuine desire throughout the Guild that we do all we can towards the maintenance of the bells and their fittings, but it often falls upon the dedicated tower keepers in churches that have regular bands and the one or two people in each District who, on behalf of the Guild, try to keep up a measure of care and attention that is urgently needed, often trying to correct several years of neglect. It is incumbent upon us all to do whatever we can to help. The Guild has provided materials; advice is available and all that is required is your help and support for your District Maintenance Officers.

Since the inception of the Guild's maintenance activities some very worthy works have been carried out from the making of the bells in several towers in the Diocese better and easier to ring and handle to getting unringable towers back into reasonable going order. The most recent has been the splendid work done at Rendham where the bells have been silent for 25 years. £15 worth of materials together with a lot of time and effort by some very dedicated ringers has brought these bells back into action.

This epitomises the concept of what we desire of the Guild's maintenance effort. Your own personal involvement can help the few who have carried out work and make some **inroads** into the great deal of maintenance than can, and indeed has **to**, be done.

We ended 1976 in sound financial condition and although the Balances of the Accounts are not so large this year we are still in a reasonable state. Expenses and inflation appear to be catching up on us but we could have had a brighter situation had I received some of the monies due before I had to close the accounts at the end of January 1978. Peal fees have brought in quite a lot more to the General Account and donations for the use of the handbells increased by £21. An Honorarium was paid to R. W. Clouston to help with his petrol costs incurred on our behalf and nearly £11 was spent on printing the draft of the new Constitution and Rules so that each member could have a copy. This year the sum of £261 was transferred to the Restoration Account.

During 1977 the sum of £700 was paid out of the Restoration account - £350 each of the Norman Tower and St. Mary's Hadleigh. This now leaves us with outstanding promises of grants for Worlington (£20), Worlingworth (£75), Earl Soham (£250) and Tattingstone (£100) - a total of £445 with a balance in the account of nearly £1750.

A lot of work has been done by Walter Perry in order to help me publish the accounts of the Maintenance Committee. These figures are the best that we can produce and behind them is a great deal of desirable maintenance work. Although discrepancies of £10.50 are shown it must be remembered that this is on valuation of stock at 1974 prices and the various people who have been doing the work probably did not account for every scrap of material used.

You may have noticed John Blythe's signature as Auditor on this year's Accounts and for stepping in at the last moment and filling the breach I offer him my sincere thanks. Joe Preastner was ill at the end of January and unable to carry out the service which he has so willingly and effectively performed for so many years. We thank him for his work on our behalf and wish him a speedy recovery.

### RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

The ringing exercise at large, and this Guild was no exception, played its full part in the celebration of the Queen's Silver Jubilee. On Jubilee Day the bells of every tower in the Diocese which could be rung sounded forth. Most of us rang in our own area - some travelled many miles to ensure that unmanned towers did not stay silent. Peals and quarter peals throughout the year have been associated with the Royal celebrations.

The peal total has risen to 136 this year, and the footnotes indicate many individual and corporate achievements. Thirteen members rang their first peal: Philip Baker, Lorna Bigg, David Blomfield, Stuart Curl, Clive Dunbavin, Jon Gent, Graham Green, Elizabeth Helliwell, Ivan Ludbrook, Valerie Moore, Alan Smith, John Steed and Helen Stevenson. Other personal milestones included John Mayle's and Walter Perry's 100th., Patricia Bailey's and Peter Mayle's 200th., Ronald Steward's 100th. Suffolk tower for a peal and Leslie Brett's 1000th. peal for the Guild. Our congratulations to you all. Also worthy of particular mention are the two peals, at Stoke-by-Clare and Newmarket, by young bands. We welcome Badwell Ash back to the peal columns after an absence of 47 years!

The A.G.M. at Beccles was well supported, as was the Striking Competition at Great Barton. Grundisburgh were worthy winners of the Mitson Shield. Other occasions we greatly enjoyed included the re-dedications of Earl Soham, the Norman Tower and Hadleigh. Through local fund-raising, Guild grants and self-help we are acting responsibly in maintaining the bells of the Diocese in ringing order: but this is a continuing task, and at no point can we allow our efforts to slacken or our attitudes to become complacent.

Regular ringing for Sunday service, and for local and District practice nights, is being well maintained. Inevitably, some areas are more active than others. Attendance at quarterly District meetings is generally a guide to the enthusiasm of an area. The re-organisation of our District Boundaries and the closer liaison envisaged within Deaneries should strengthen local cooperation. The Recruitment and Training committee is keen to be of assistance with both initial training and the provision of instruction at more advanced levels. To this end we aim to have a whole day course of instruction in the autumn of 1978 - so watch for further details in the Guild Newsletter and the Ringing World.

Finally, my grateful thanks to all those who have organised teaching, service and peal ringing during 1977. Our special thanks for all the time and effort he has given to the Guild go to Howard Egglestone; and our best wishes for the future go to Howard, Margaret and Helen as they move to Newbury.

May our new Guild structure help to invigorate local ringing during the coming year and give us a new awareness of the privileges and responsibilities we enjoy as Church Bell ringers.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

I wonder how many positively acted upon my request at Beccles to get at least one new member during the year. At Beccles we enjoyed a well attended Annual General Meeting where a new Chairman - Roly Whiting - was elected when George Pipe resigned.

Your Executive Committee have met regularly and I hope that their deliberations, together with those of the Central Council, were conveyed to you by the various people concerned. In addition the regular Guild Newsletter should have reached you three times during the year - there should be one copy per tower.

Other events during the year included the Striking Competition at Great Barton in May, a South East District Car Treasure Hunt (very enjoyable) and a General Meeting in Ipswich which was poorly attended when the new Constitution and Rules were adopted, Alan Smith was elected Guild Treasurer and Walter Perry was elected Maintenance Officer. A unique Guild Social was held at Bramford when Les Brett's achievement of 1000 peals for the Guild was recognised by presenting him with an inscribed bell. We also presented Howard and Margaret Egglestone with a small gift each by way of a 'thank you' for the unceasing and valuable work they have done for us in Suffolk. The Reverend Lawrence Pizzey was married in July and in December he was inducted as Rector of West Stow. Our congratulations and good wishes are extended to both Ann and Lawrence and we hope they are happy in their new life.

On that happy note I will end as I look forward to a year of renewed effort and success for all of us in the Suffolk Guild.

### Eric G. Bennett - Norfolk

### William B. Duncan - Norfolk

Bill Duncan was a good striker, especially on eight and liked nothing better than a peal of Double Norwich, well rung. He was 84 and rang many peals for the Guild.

### Walter Crisp - East Bergholt

A ringer for over 40 years, Wally's association with the Art was very special. Although he could ring call changes on tower bells his metier was the unique skill of the 'Bell Cage' where he was captain from 1963 to 1977.

We shall miss his cheery face replete with cap and who can number the thousands from all over the world that must have seen him ring?

### Cornelius J. Gibson - Wenhaston

Jack Gibson was a real northeasterner. If you read Jobson's splendid book: 'North East Suffolk' you will find the likes of Jack in its pages. A delightful companion, good six bell ringer and always pleasant and obliging. It is difficult to imagine the Blythburgh area without him.

He rang over 200 peals, 127 of them with one of our past Chairmen-John Blythe.

### Harry Hall - Framlingham

With his brother John, he was a familiar figure in the Framlingham area, especially between the wars. He rang several peals for the N.D.A. and about 50 for the Guild. Harry liked his pint, his course of Treble Bob and above all ringers' outings!

He had links of course with the late George Symonds when he too lived at Framlingham and indeed with the famous clergyman - composer - the Reverend J. Holme Pilkington. We shall miss the 'bor' Harry keenly.

Leonard E. Last - Hoxne

Very so often a large gap is left in our Guild, when someone who has contributed to its affairs in the widest possible way passes on. Such a man was Leonard Last, an enthusiastic supporter to the end of his 80 years.

He was an extremely talented man, knowledgeable on Suffolk history, its churches, bells and numerous other subjects. In 1912 he conducted the youngest ever peal, average age 15, at Winfarthing and later took part in many peals, including a 10,000 with the foremost six bell band of their day - Thornham Magna.

He died Hoxne on March 8th. We are grateful too for the un-failing support his wife always gave him.

Canon Arthur A. Muxlow M.A. - Stowmarket

In the last fifteen years the Suffolk Guild has seen a happy increase in ringing Clergy of which he was one. Fortunately for us and Stowmarket he taught his family as well and great has been their contribution and service in the Diocese, in their town and Deanery and the Guild.

He rang 10 peals for us and gave support to all our activities. We know his family will carry on that tradition.

Charles J. Pledger - Stoke-by-Clare

Churchwarden, vergers and ringer for nearly 60 years, Charles passed away on May 6th. It was a privilege to know this faithful servant of both his church and his village.

Oh for more like him.

Maurice T. Symonds - Lavenham

The name Symonds is synonymous with Lavenham's noble belfry and 'Morrie' was like his family before him, most loyal to both the local band and the Suffolk Guild, of which he was a founder member.

The Symonds' talents extended to conducting and handbells and their meticulous striking was a hallmark of all that they did.

Lavenham bells would rank as possibly one of the ten most popular for outings in the kingdom and one remembers the unselfish way that Maurice made arrangements and gave visitors such a welcome. He rang 43 peals for the Guild and several for the Ely D.A.

We also remember Mrs. Sybil Knox and any of our members' relatives.

May they rest in peace.
