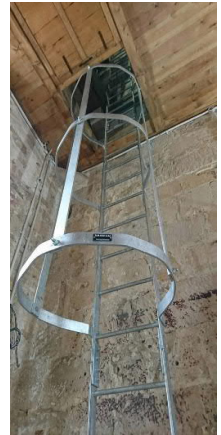

Foreword from the Chairman

It's amazing to think that I've already been in post for nearly 9 months as the time has flown by. I have tried to hit the ground running by attending events and meetings in all of the Districts so I can get some ideas to boost attendance and fuel enthusiasm across the Guild. The recent ADMs have been quite revealing in this respect and have confirmed my suspicions that there is no one solution to the question of how we can provide something for everyone.

Those of you who have read my 'meet the Chairman' page on the Guild website will know that I am keen to make what we do as a Guild more sustainable by making better use of our resources, YOU the members. Perhaps the best example of this was the response we had for the 100th anniversary of the Armistice on Sunday 11th November with ringing at all but three of our ringable towers for this special occasion. We even received a letter of thanks from the Lord Lieutenant of Suffolk, Clare, Countess of Euston, which is now available on the Guild website. She referred to the fact that more bells were rung in more church towers in Suffolk than in any other county in the land and went on to say 'it reminded us all what good strong people we are, and what can be achieved when we all stand together'.

This could not have been achieved without some excellent team-work (and multiple email conversations) to ensure that enough ringers were in the right place at the right time. I am aware that some of the groups who organised 'mini outings' were already in existence but I'm hoping that other groups who formed specifically for the occasion may now go on to support each other for other events such as practices, weddings, outings and meetings etc. As ringers, we are always keen to tell new recruits what a happy and sociable bunch of people we are, so maybe the solemn occasion we have just marked could be the start of a more productive sharing of our resources across all Districts of the Guild.

I don't wish to steal the thunder from the other Guild Officers regarding their reports for 2018 but other notable achievements this past year within the Guild include:-

- Enabling nine members to ring their first peals within Guild peal week (RM report)
- Winning the High Sheriff's award for Suffolk Heritage (PRO report) – the High Sheriff joined us at the Guild's 95th Anniversary Dinner in March where 84 attended the hastily reorganised event due to the arrival of the 'Beast from the East' earlier that month
- Completing major restoration/augmentation work at Cretingham, Little Cornard and St. Margaret's Ipswich (BAC report)
- Maintaining an excellent Guild website with over 2,000 pages of content – while I recognise that 'surfing' is not everyone's idea of fun and that some members do not have access to the website, this is a very valuable communication tool (Webmaster's report)
- 'Hatching' the idea, organising, hosting and taking the top two places in the first George W Pipe 12 bell striking competition (Norman Tower 1st, St Mary le Tower, Ipswich 2nd)

Although 2019 does not perhaps have the same focus as 2018 it promises to be another busy year. The Guild will be hosting the Ridgman 10 bell striking competition at the Norman Tower in June 2019 so please come along and support the team. Mancroft Ringing Discovery Centre – at the time of writing, two District training events have been booked at this fantastic resource in Norwich (SE in April & NW+SW in June). I would urge all members to consider booking a session here as it truly has something for everyone, whatever your aspirations as a ringer.

And finally, I will continue to post a document on the website showing which Tower, District and Guild events I'm planning to attend so do please take the opportunity to come and ring with me and share your thoughts and ideas!

Obituaries

Gill Waterson, Pettistree

Gill learned to ring at Grundisburgh in the mid-1980s. Although her initial visits to the tower were as transport for son Ben and daughter Molly, Gill was persuaded into handling lessons and quickly discovered an enjoyment of ringing which continued for the next three decades. Her first peal was at Grundisburgh in 1987, in a band that also included Ben and Molly, but her peal total never reached double figures. Instead she loved quarter peals, ringing around 1500 in total, particularly at her home tower of Pettistree, where she was a loyal member of the band for many years. She also became involved in the wider ringing scene in Suffolk, with stints as Southeast District Secretary and Loes Deanery Rep.

Gill passed away in July 2018 after a short battle with an aggressive brain tumour. She will be remembered as a steady, reliable ringer who rarely made a mistake, and was always there to provide smiling support for learners and friends.

Alan Foreman, Ipswich, St Matthew

Alan, along with his wife Audrey, were amongst a number of volunteers who came forward from the congregation at St. Matthew's to learn to ring in the early 1990s. Like so many who learn late in life, Alan never found ringing easy, but enjoyed what he did. He was a regular Sunday service ringer at St. Matthew's and attended weekly practices at Sproughton. A gentle, quiet and unassuming gentleman, Alan had a cheeky sense of humour and hugely enjoyed any ringing-related social gathering, particularly in the years following Audrey's passing. He was genuinely surprised and delighted to have found both a new skill to learn in later life and the associated camaraderie that came with learning to ring.

Rolie Whiting, Nayland

Rolie learned to ring after his family moved from Clacton on Sea to Nayland in 1940. He lived the rest of his life in Nayland. He took the lead in having the bells rehung in 1972 and was Tower Captain for over thirty years. During that time, he taught many people to ring, including his wife Diana and daughter Christine. Many of them fondly recall his infinite patience with them while they were learning.

A quiet, thoughtful man, uncomfortable in the limelight, Rolie nevertheless made many ringing friends in the surrounding towers of SW Suffolk and NE Essex and held various offices in the Suffolk Guild of Ringers; SW District secretary for many years, Guild Chairman 1977-1980, and a Vice President. He was so well-known in Suffolk and Essex that Christine often finds herself being introduced to ringers as 'Rolie Whiting's daughter'.

Rolie was also instrumental in providing a set of handbells for Nayland church, and conducted the handbell group in concerts featuring favourite tunes or Christmas carols. Entertaining the residents of the local old people's home was a favourite venue.

Although ill-health meant that he had to give up ringing in later life, Rolie still attended practices when he could. He was delighted when in January 2018 a peal was rung at Nayland to celebrate his 90th birthday. Another was planned for October to celebrate his and Diana's Diamond (60th) Wedding Anniversary, but sadly it was not to be. He was taken to hospital the day before it was due to be rung and he died peacefully there on 30th November. The postponed anniversary peal was instead rung in his memory on 8th December. He will be greatly missed by his family and his many ringing friends.

Maureen Slinger, Palgrave

Maureen was formerly the Tower Captain at Palgrave. She died on 5th October and on 29th October on the afternoon of her funeral a quarter peal was rung in her memory at Oakley.

Arthur Finch, Long Melford

Arthur passed away peacefully in his sleep at his home in Burwell. Arthur was a member of the Essex Guild, ringing at Foxearth, where he was also the Headmaster of Foxearth Primary School. When he retired from teaching he moved to Long Melford where he joined the Suffolk Guild and was a member for nearly 50 years. Arthur rang regularly at Holy Trinity, Long Melford and supported the SW District for many years, climbing many towers including Lavenham right up until he moved to Burwell to be closer to his 3 daughters. He was 92 years young at this point. A regular cyclist, Arthur took part in the Church bike ride every year, clocking up 20 churches each time, except on one occasion where he had a puncture and was disappointed that he had only done 19, especially as he didn't have too far to go. On 24th February 2018, we not only lost a ringer but also a very close friend, who is sadly missed by many.

Charlie Ablitt, Stratford St Mary

Charlie Ablitt, a long standing ringer at Stratford St Mary, died in hospital on 6th December 2018 after a period of ill health. Charlie was involved with the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for many years. Until a few years ago, he had been Tower Captain at Stratford for over 40 years and had taught countless people to ring. He was also a close friend of Rolie Whiting who sadly died six days earlier. He was taught bellringing by Walter Bailey and he rang two peals, both at Higham, and both credited to the Suffolk Guild. His first peal was Plain Bob Minor on September 27th 1973. He rang the 4th and his daughter Deborah, whom he had taught to ring (along with his other two children) rang the treble. The other peal was on 16th May 1981, Kent and Plain Bob Minor. Charlie rang the treble to this peal. His other daughter, Sarah, rang the second, one of two first-pealers that day. Charlie taught many youngsters to ring and a number of them went on to ring peals which was a huge achievement for him. Charlie also served as SW District Chairman for a number of years and was a very competent hand-bell ringer. Charlie and Pat celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary in 2006 and the Guild rang a peal to commemorate this; and again in 2010 to celebrate Charlie's 80th Birthday.

Charlie's death is a huge loss to ringing, to the village of Stratford St Mary, his many friends and of course, most of all to his family.

Ray Rivers, Unattached (Great Yarmouth Minster)

Ray Rivers, who was 85, lived at Oulton Broad, but did much of his ringing with the Suffolk Guild. He was a regular ringer at Halesworth for some years and more recently at Rumburgh. He learned to ring at Hurst in Berkshire in his teens. Later in life he lived and rang at Great Yarmouth. After a few years' gap he returned to ringing in 1992 when his wife Bel learned to ring. Together they helped develop the band at Yarmouth and Ray called a local band peal there for the Millennium. In all, he rang 29 peals, 8 for the Suffolk Guild, and numerous quarters, mostly in Suffolk. He was a gentle, likeable man who would go out of his way to support ringing within a wide radius of his home.

Don Mills, Bures

Don passed away on 2nd April 2018. He was a great family man who had a life-long association with bell ringing with most of his ringing along the Suffolk/Essex border. Don was taught to ring by his father Leslie and together with his mother they formed a talented ringing family. A peal of Minor at Wormingford in 1953 was Don's first as conductor. A peal of Plain Bob Minor at Pebmarsh in February 1954, by a teenage all-Bures band, average age 15 years 1 month and called by Don, set a record for the youngest band ever to have achieved this.

Don's father Leslie was instrumental in augmenting the ring to eight in 1951, which Don managed as tower captain when his father retired. Don was a highly talented ringer who taught many people to handle a bell and subsequently gave great support to anyone learning. A peal was rung in his memory at St. Mary's, Bures on 19th July 2018. May he rest in peace.

Trustees' Annual Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The Charity's registered address is Denton House, Colchester Road, Ardleigh, Colchester, CO7 7NS. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2017.

Principal Objectives

The purpose of the Charity is to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing; and to promote and advise on the preservation of bells in an efficient condition.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing

The Guild aims to offer support to its members to not only ring for Sunday service and practice nights but also to improve and progress their ringing. District events have been held across the whole Guild including open practices, quarter peal weeks/months, training activities, outings and social gatherings. Whilst the number of people attending these events is difficult to gauge, a broad spectrum of the membership get involved with these and hopefully benefit from the opportunity to ring at different towers and meet other ringers.

The total of quarter peals rung has increased this year to 450 (441 in 2017) but the number of people involved remains fairly steady at 374 (379 in 2017) as does the number of towers at 98. Peals rung in 2018 have also increased from 103 to 108 (the highest since 2014) in 48 Suffolk towers and this year includes two 12 bell peals. This increase is due largely to the re-introduction of peal week which also enabled nine ringers to ring their first peals.

The Recruitment and Training Committee continues to hold quarterly meetings to review training and recruitment activities and opportunities across the Guild. This year the committee attended Gather 2018 and used the mini ring to encourage young people from across the Diocese to 'have a go'. An exciting new opportunity also now exists in Norwich with the opening of the Mancroft Ringing Discovery centre and members are being encouraged to make use of these state of the art training facilities.

The commemoration of the end of WW1 created a lot of opportunities in 2018 through peals (13 rung), quarter peals and Ringing Remembers with 30 new ringers being recruited. Armistice 100 on Sunday 11th November was the pinnacle of achievement for the year with ringing at all but three of the ringable towers in the Guild at some point during the weekend.

The excellent news that we had won the Suffolk Heritage Award was announced at the Guild's 95th Anniversary Dinner held at Elmswell in March which was attended by the High Sheriff himself. Even the Beast from the East couldn't stop 84 people from enjoying this five yearly occasion although it did delay it by three weeks!

Restoration activities

2018 has been another busy year for the Belfry Advisory Committee with three major restorations being completed at Cretingham, Little Cornard & St. Margaret's Ipswich. The teams of people who worked on these prominent restorations are to be congratulated for their determination and hard work as the resulting peals of bells are an important addition to the rings of bells rated as condition 10 within the Guild. The work of the BAC is never-ending however and projects in the pipeline include Redgrave, Stowmarket, Laxfield, Fornham St. Martin, Combs and Hitcham.

Guild Finances

Reserves Policy

In line with advice from Larking Gowen, the appointed examiners for the Guild, the Trustees have formulated a Reserves Policy. The Guild will expect to hold at the bank a surplus of approximately one year's running costs.

Policies

All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the GMC, but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project. In order to respond to the short-term need to provide financial support to training activities, the GMC introduced a process to enable grants of up to £50 to be made immediately, at the discretion of the Ringing Master, and grants of up to £500 to be made within seven days at the discretion of the Guild Executive, in both cases subject to appropriate records being kept and presented to the GMC. As an enabling measure, the Public Relations Officer has been given a budget, the purpose being to enable greater flexibility, and faster reaction, to PR recruitment opportunities when they arise.

General Fund

Net income to the General Fund, before transfers to the Restoration Fund, was 51% up on 2017. However, after transfers for subsidising the Guild Dinner and half of all subscriptions/peal fees, there was an increase of just £1,744.15 year on year. It should be noted that this modest increase resulted mainly from an extraordinary donation of £1,000 from the Suffolk Community Foundation, and as in recent years the only guaranteed income to the General Fund (i.e. 50% of subscriptions) did not meet our expenses.

Restoration Fund

At year end the Restoration Fund totalled £57,795.64, including £38,850.00 already allocated for approved grants and awaiting payment. This leaves just £18,945.64 available for new grant applications.

During the year grants totalling £28,900.00 were approved for Stowmarket (£11,000), Laxfield (£12,000), Fornham St Martin (£5,600) and Gt Barton (£300).

Other Restricted Funds:

The Golden Bottle Trust Fund provided £142 for training activities and stands at £4858.00.

All other restricted funds (Library Fund, Handbell Fund, Jubilee Fund, Pipe Family Trust Fund and St Peter's Sudbury Fund) have positive balances.

Belfry Advisory Committee Report—Winston Girling

The Committee met in February, June and October in 2018 and discussed a great deal of voluntary work carried out by Members. Together with the usual jobs, both small and large, a lot of time was taken up in discussing applications for grants from the Guild Restoration Fund. Three major restorations have completed during 2018, and there are also several others where your Technical Advisor and also the Diocesan Advisor have visited and reported with a view to restoration.

In my view the crowning glory of 2018 must be the completion of restoration at St. Margaret's, Ipswich. At the Dedication on 29th April, before a packed Church, the bells were rung and proved that this project has been a great success. John and Shirley Girt and all involved are to be complimented on their hard work, overcoming many difficulties along the way, to bring this to such a successful conclusion. It was a great privilege to be asked to ring in the touch after the service.

The bells at Cretingham were completed after major restoration and augmentation to six. Similarly, Little Cornard bells have now been dedicated and at both towers the result has been very successful, providing two, easy-to-ring and pleasant sixes. Together with St. Margaret's we now have three more peals of bells which can be rated as condition 10. Again, all concerned are to be complimented on their worthwhile hard work and determination.

In addition, as I write, I understand that Redgrave bells, together with the repaired timber frame, should be returned to the tower and all up and ringing by very early in 2019. It will be interesting to see and hear the results of this difficult and protracted major restoration. Originally these bells should have been augmented. However, major objections by the owners of this redundant church left only the option of keeping the original 6 bells and returning them to the timber frame.

Grants have also been offered to Stowmarket, Laxfield and Fornham St. Martin. In addition there are several other towers, including Combs and Hitcham, where restorations may soon be underway.

I would like to thank the Members of the BAC who, along with others, have worked hard to keep our bells up and running and will continue to do so. No doubt 2019 will be just as challenging.

Ringling Master's Report –Tom Scase

In the Annual Report last year, I mentioned 2017 had glimpses of what we can achieve in terms of promoting and delivering opportunities in ringing, and hoped 2018 would see a greater proportion of time spent focusing on this. In this respect, I feel we have made progress.

The re-introduction of a peal week, for example, saw nine first peelers – congratulations to: Joe Findlay, Matt Newson, Tig Sweet, Yasmin Haddock, Carmen Wright, Zoe Wright, Joshua Watkins, Kate Gill and Jimmy Yeoman. Congratulations to Sue Williamson who also rang her first peal during the year. Ten first peelers during the year is a significant achievement – particularly compared with recent years. It would be good, though, to see these first peelers being encouraged to ring more; as I write, only Joshua and Jimmy have gone on to ring another peal.

The initiative to ring at as many towers as possible on Sunday 11th November 2018 for Armistice 100 was a great success, both as a commemoration of the Great War and as a means of promoting our art. Only a handful of rings across the Guild were not rung at some point on Saturday 10th/Sunday 11th November 2018 – thank you to everyone who gave up their time to help achieve this. Thank you, also, to all involved in helping bring this to fruition, particularly Neal Dodge whose coordination was invaluable, and to Councillor, and former ringer, Robin Vickery whose conversation with me back in June 2017 was the catalyst for this idea.

I was pleased to have attended the South East and North East Annual District Meetings (ADMs); unfortunately I was unable to attend the South West or North West ADMs, due to other commitments. I would like to attend more District events and practices in 2019, and will endeavour to do so, although it's difficult to fit everything in sometimes!

Each year, the Guild Striking Competitions provide an incentive to focus on good striking. The 2018 six bell competitions were held at Earl Stonham. Congratulations to Ipswich, St Mary Le Tower on winning the Mitson Shield method competition and to Great Barton on winning the Lester Brett call change competition. The eight bell competition was held at Debenham. Congratulations to the South East District on winning the Rose Trophy Competition. Our thanks go to Cherril and Jeremy Spiller for judging, and delivering very constructive comments. I appreciate feedback, and there have been various suggestions and discussions about the possibility of re-introducing a set method and touch for the eight bell competition in 2019. The rules allow for this, and as such it's an approach I'll give serious consideration to. If you have a view, do let me know.

The 2018 Ridgman Trophy competition was held at St Peter's, St Albans, and the ten ringers representing the Guild were placed fourth, as was the case in 2017. Once again, this was a respectable placing, though, if the truth is told, the three teams above us had significantly fewer faults, so there's still some way to go. The Ridgman Trophy is due to be held in Bury St Edmunds in 2019, let's see whether home advantage helps.

Quarter peal ringing continues throughout Suffolk and, as usual, Neal Dodge's excellent analysis is an interesting read. There were a few more quarters in Suffolk in 2018 compared to 2017; however the number is still fewer than 2016 and over 100 fewer than 2015. I don't think the details of my next sentence have changed from any of my previous reports! This is because Pettistree remains the leading tower for quarter peals, and David and Lesley Steed the most prolific quarter peal ringers in Suffolk. Eight ringers rang their first quarter peals during the year – well done to: Tim Forsey, Helen Bridgman, Derek Gadd, Rachel Tunbridge, Ellie Harle, Ben Turpin, Sidney Ricketts and Keith Dennis. Apologies if I've missed any.

Turning to peal ringing, I have already highlighted the success of peal week; however in overall terms, peals for the Guild remain in a relatively healthy state, particularly when compared with some of our neighbouring Associations. Peals rung for the Guild in 2018

remain at comparatively consistent number, increasing by five, to 108, compared with 2017. More Guild members, 123, rang a peal for the Guild in 2018 (34 more than in 2017). However, some of this can be attributed to a notable number of Non-Resident Life members ringing peals with our Guild.

Thanks to Pealbase, I note the following personal achievements: 2,200th as conductor – David G Salter; 1,900th peal and 700th as conductor – Alan P Mayle; 1,600th peal – Mary E Dunbavin; 1,100th peal – Cherril Spiller; 1,000th peal – Brian E Whiting; 600th peal – Christine A Knight, Richard Munnings and Winston Girling; 400th peal – Neville F Whittell; 350th peal – Ian J Culham; 300th peal – Jed Flatters; 250th peal – Nigel F C Gale; 200th peal – David A Potts and P Mark Ogden; 50th peal – Michael J Cowling and Rowan P Wilson. Apologies if I've missed any.

The annual Veterans' afternoon at Debenham was, as usual, an enjoyable event. Held on the afternoon of the second Wednesday in July, each year, this is an event to put in your diaries now!

The Suffolk Guild Dinner, despite the unavoidable postponement of the original date due to snow, was an enjoyable event – thanks to Carl Melville and particularly Alan Stanley for their efforts in ensuring this all came together.

I have continued to attend some Belfry Advisor Committee (BAC) meetings throughout 2018, and would like to reiterate our thanks to Winston Girling and the BAC members for all the time and hard work they put in, in helping maintain our rings. Equally, there are other members who have helped with restorations and maintenance and we are grateful to them for their support too – I know, for example, Jed Flatters' assistance with the re-hanging and augmentation at Cretingham was greatly appreciated.

In 2019, let's all continue to support our Guild, the events our Districts organise for the benefit of each and every member, our local practice nights, and most importantly service ringing. In doing this, and more, we will continue to provide ringing opportunities across Suffolk.

Guild Handbells & Mini Ring Trustee's Report—Brian Whiting

Handbells

The Guild has five sets of handbells:

25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)

16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)

13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)

13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

14 bells by probably Mears size 18 in G (diatonic)

The set of 25 have been used for tune ringing during the year and currently all sets are back with the trustee, with the exception of one of the sets of 13, which is in the NE district. The clapper of the 15C of the 25 broke and has been replaced; otherwise the bells remain in good order with the exception of the set of 14 bells which were donated to the Guild in 2017 by John Symonds of Lavenham.

The loan of any of the sets of handbells is subject to the regulations printed on page 85 of this report.

Vestey Ring

The Vestey Ring is a portable peal of six, tenor 8lb 5oz in B.

Public Relations Officer's Report - Neal Dodge

2018 commenced with Alan Stanley and I having the pleasure of accepting the High Sheriff's Suffolk Heritage Award on behalf of the Guild from the Suffolk Community Foundation. This was in recognition of the Guild's role in cherishing our county's history and heritage. We were up against some extremely tough competition, so it just proves that the work we undertake is outstanding and literally award-winning! We don't often consider the wider role the Guild and our members play in the local community, so it was wonderful to be recognised for the hard work that we do in keeping the bells ringing that brings joy to so many people.

At the excellently hosted striking contest in May at Earl Stonham and Debenham, we were joined by George Vestey our Guild Patron, and High Sheriff of Suffolk for 2018/19. George's family has a long connection with the Guild since his Grandfather became a Patron in 1958, a connection which George is keen to continue. He was most pleased to hear how his father's legacy, The Vestey Ring, was being put to good use both in and outside of Suffolk.

On the second annual Suffolk Day in June, we rose to the challenge and 26 towers rang out in celebration of our wonderful county, including 10 quarter peals and a peal. A quarter peal at Theberton was featured on ITV Anglia news and both of Suffolk's Bishops started the day by chiming the bells at Ipswich St Nicholas. Suffolk Day 2019 is already being planned, so please put Friday 21st June in your diaries and hopefully even more towers can ring out on this special day, in which bells play a key role.

On the social media front, our Twitter account @SuffolkBells, continues to grow with our tweets being seen by around 5,000 users a month. It's become a great way to interact with the public and other organisations who comment about ringing. The lively debate continues on our Guild Facebook Group with nearly 250 members. Please do sign up and join in the conversation.

The highlight of the year has to be the nationwide Ringing Remembers campaign. This campaign aimed to recruit and teach 1,400 new ringers in time for Armistice 2018, symbolically replacing those ringers killed in WW1. The Guild has recruited 30 new ringers to date, but overall, the national target of 1,400 was nearly doubled. The initiative has provided a lasting legacy of a new generation of ringers, alongside a greater public awareness of ringing.

November marked the 100th anniversary of the Armistice that the Ringing Remembers campaign was building towards. Our plan was to have every tower in the Guild ring out on Sunday 11th November. This was a little daunting when it was first mooted back in November 2017, but yet again, we rose to the challenge with the bells from nearly every ringable tower in the Guild sounding out at some point that weekend, which amounts to 200 towers in total! This level of near complete Guild coverage was not attempted or achieved anywhere else, so it can be said more towers were rung in Suffolk than any other county. Even looking back through history, this was potentially the largest ever piece of collective ringing in Suffolk. What an achievement!

Lastly, but most importantly I must thank all of you, because we're lucky enough not just to have one Public Relations Officer, but over 700; for we are all ambassadors of ringing. Most people take their first steps based on encouragement and explanation from you, so my challenge to Guild members this year is to speak to your colleagues, neighbours, friends, and family and tell them what a great time can be had when you go ringing!

Librarian's Report - Abby Antrobus

This year I have had requests for information (photographs, old minutes), and questions about books with Suffolk connections that we may wish to add to the library. John Loveless has also sent items from Howard Egglestone's papers relating to Suffolk, some of which were featured in his articles in the Ringing World this year that celebrated 72 years of the Mills family connection to Bures (pages 760-1 and 788-9, August 10th and August 17th 2018). The papers include a photo of the band who rang the 10,080 at Debenham in March 1968 - taken in the pub. The article highlights that more ringing history could and should be written, and to make it a bit easier in Suffolk, the Records Office has provided an extract of their catalogue details for our collection, so I can amend our own with reference numbers for anyone wishing to look at items there.

At the time of writing, I am planning a visit to the Norman Tower to check the library. Please do send any papers/leaflets – for example, from dedication services - the collection in the Records Office is live and we can add to it and ensure that it captures something of our activities today.

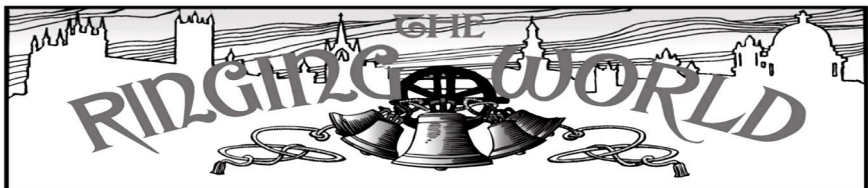
Webmaster's Report—Chris Garner

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor.

The key of a ring (i.e. the note of the tenor) is given in cents (i.e. hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C#-20m and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. At these churches the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or deputy, and if necessary the architect concerned, must be present when assessment of the bells or tower is taking place.

District Report

In 2018, we welcomed fifteen recruits, including a number through Ringing Remembers. There were five first peals, and completed projects at Cretingham and Ipswich St Margaret.

We started the year with ringing at Pettistree and Felixstowe in January and February. In April at Holbrook, there was a raising-and-lowering session, and an ART Module 1 Course held in May at Ipswich St Matthew.

Peal Secretary's Report—Christine Knight

The Guild peal total of 108 was the highest since 2014, due largely to the highly successful reintroduction of Guild Peal Week in February, during which fifteen peals were rung. The year also saw the first peal on the restored ring at St Margaret's, Ipswich, widely acclaimed as a magnificent transformation achieved by the team led by John and Shirley Girt. A peal of Double Norwich CB Major on 4th August was the first peal on the restored bells. During the year, peals were rung at 48 Suffolk towers and two other venues, Ardleigh in Essex and Lichfield Cathedral.

Mirroring the national picture, World War 1 centenary peals continued throughout the year. In all, thirteen peals were rung to commemorate those who gave their lives. As the centenary of the Armistice approached, awareness of the enormity of the sacrifice in individual parishes became more apparent. Ten peals were rung between September and November alone. At Little Thurlow, Hacheston, Elmsett, Ipswich, St Margaret, Offton and Bardwell peals were rung to honour the memory of local men who made the ultimate sacrifice. There were also peals to mark the centenary of the deaths of local ringers. A peal at Pettistree on 25th March remembered Private David Leggett, and Bombardier William Lovett was commemorated by a peal at Aldeburgh on 17th June. No less than three ringers were lost at Monks Eleigh; a peal on this challenging six was rung on 27th October in memory of Private Edward Hollox, Corporal Robert Keeble and Private Charles Varo. The Great War also claimed the lives of three Lavenham ringers, Private George Lambert, Private Charles Poulson and Lance Corporal Thomas Pryke. As Lavenham was formerly in the Ely Diocese, a joint Suffolk Guild/Ely DA band was assembled to ring a peal in their honour on 24th November. On the Armistice Centenary weekend, the bells of the Cathedral's Norman Tower were rung half-muffled on 10th November to a peal of Grandsire Cinques. On 11th November, Armistice Centenary Day itself, a peal of 7 Surprise Minor was rung at Buxhall. At Horringer, a specially composed 5100 of Armistice S Major, conducted by Stephen Pettman, was rung on 30th November, it also being the 100th peal in the tower.

Peals were also rung nationwide to mark the 300th anniversary of the first peal of Grandsire Triples, which was rung at St Peter Mancroft in Norwich on 26th August 1718. Two peals were rung by the Guild as part of this commemoration. Louis Suggett called his own composition of Grandsire Triples at Bardwell on 25th August. On 29th August at Grundisburgh, Stephen Pettman called what is thought to be the original composition by John Garthon, which includes a special call known as a 'hic'.

Some other individual peals deserve special mention. On 7th February, in a peal at The Wolery, Mary Dunbavin became the seventh person to ring a thousand peals for the Guild. Brian Whiting also achieved a very significant milestone by ringing his thousandth peal, Plain Bob Major at Horringer on 15th February. He chose to share this occasion with local ringer Joshua Watkins, who rang his first peal on that day. An incredible example of teamwork was evident at Tostock on 10th June, when a peal of 41 Spliced Surprise Minor was rung by a NW District band, conducted by Nigel Gale. The footnotes make very impressive reading, being the first peal of Spliced for three members of the band, most methods for two, and also first peal of Spliced as conductor: a magnificent achievement. Also worthy of mention is the peal of Double Norwich CB Major rung on the back eight at Ipswich, St Mary-le-Tower on 16th September. This was a challenging method on a 34cwt eight, especially for the tenor ringer, Ian Culham.

Many of the patterns in Guild peal ringing remained unchanged in 2018. Attempts by the Aldeburgh Second Sunday Band have continued and their final peal of the year, Triduum Surprise Major on 9th December was also the 350th peal on the bells and the 250th of Surprise Major there. Regular attempts at the Wolery Mini-Ring also continued, with the 400th peal

on the bells being reached on 4th July. In the monthly attempts on the light eight at St Mary-le-Tower, the focus has shifted recently to 'Project Pickled Walnut', a project to ring Surprise Major methods named after Suffolk towns and villages. So far two peals have been rung, Framlingham S Major and Clare S Major. Interest in Spliced Surprise Minor continues, and 41 Spliced was rung three times during the year, twice on towerbells and once on handbells.

It is always pleasing to see the 'firsts' achieved by less experienced ringers in peal footnotes. In Peal Week, in addition to the nine first peelers, there was a first of Grandsire Caters, a first of Surprise Royal and a first on handbells. Later in the year, there was also a first on 12 and another first pealer in a peal at St Matthew's, Ipswich on 24th June. It was also good to see two 12 bell peals as 2017 was the first year since 1976 with no 12 bell peals at all. Two peals of Grandsire Cinques were rung, both at the Norman Tower, but one by a predominantly non-resident band. Peals on higher numbers are a vital opportunity for progression. It is disappointing that no peals of Maximus have been rung for the Guild since 2016.

There are many positives to take from the Guild's peal ringing activity. In regularity and annual totals, peal ringing is more deeply embedded in the culture of the Guild than in some of our neighbouring associations. However, the majority of our peals continue to be organised for experienced peal ringers. Some very talented young ringers have left the county in recent years and learning opportunities are needed throughout the year to enable budding peal ringers of all ages to develop their skills. From just one first pealer in 2017 to a total of ten in 2018 is a magnificent achievement. However, only two of the nine first peelers from Peal Week rang further peals later in the year. In fact, outside Peal Week there were just two peals which were obviously organised as learning opportunities for less experienced ringers. Peals like the Minor (3m) rung at Wissett on 20th May, which contained a '1st inside' and 'most methods' and the Minor (7m) at Exning on 16th August, which was also a '1st inside' are invaluable stepping stones. The Master made a tremendous effort to open up peal ringing to a wider cross-section of our membership in Peal Week. Hopefully, more peal organisers will emulate this by providing opportunities for progression during the year. As always, I should like to thank Michelle Rolph, Brian Whiting and David Salter for their work on the peals section of this Report. Special thanks go to David Salter for providing information and support whilst recovering from serious illness.

Tips for Learning Methods

Learning methods - first steps

- 1) Identify your learning style – do you prefer to learn by seeing, hearing or doing?
- 2) Learn the method in small bits to start with, then join the bits up
- 3) Relate any new method to what you already know
- 4) Familiarise yourself with new types of work
- 5) Learn where you pass the treble and where you work with it
- 6) A poor handling style can affect progress so get someone to video you then listen to their advice!
- 7) Try to maintain a constant rhythm (which should be the same as the rest of the band)
- 8) Stand behind someone and follow them ringing the method you are learning
- 9) Go out to other towers where they ring what you are learning (& attend Guild and District events)
- 10) Do not be afraid to ask for help – ask several people as they may explain things differently
- 11) Do your homework (before the practice night)

Learning methods - next steps

- 1) Learn the basics first and then build up to more complicated methods
- 2) Look for signposts (roll ups, familiar changes, passing & working with your before & after course bells)
- 3) Learn the place bell order and all of the starts
- 4) Learn the structure of the method by using the grid (shows blue line for each bell for one lead)
- 5) Learn the bobs and singles
- 6) Practise ringing the method on Abel
- 7) Do your homework (before the practice night)
- 8) Listen critically to your striking (whatever you are ringing)
- 9) Attend Training Days & Ringing Courses
- 10) Attempt a quarter peal

Safeguarding Statement

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers takes the safeguarding and protection of children (under 18s) and vulnerable adults very seriously. It recognises that the welfare of children and vulnerable adults is paramount and that we have a duty of care when they are in our charge. We will do everything that we can to provide a safe and caring environment whilst they attend our activities. All children and vulnerable adults will be treated with respect and dignity.

Safeguarding Policy

The Guild, as advised by the CCCBR, follows the national “Promoting a Safer Church” policy as adopted by the Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich:

- Local tower arrangements should always be approved by the PCC in line with the Parish Safeguarding Policy¹. The Tower Captain should have a copy of the Parish Safeguarding Policy and ensure that ringers have access to it.
- All ringers should complete the online safeguarding training course ‘CO’ as advised by the PSO² or Incumbent for the tower where they are listed. It is accessible via this web address <https://safeguardingtraining.cofeportal.org/>. The certificate awarded should be retained and the date of completion notified to the PSO.
- Tower Captains and ringing teachers must complete ‘CO’ first, then attend a “face to face” half day course, ‘C2 Safeguarding Leadership’, in the Diocese every three years.²
- All Tower Captains and ringing teachers MUST hold a current clear DBS check status IF their role includes the training of children or vulnerable adults.
- Any person requiring a DBS check must first complete a Confidential Declaration Form, available here http://www.cofesuffolk.org/uploads/Lay_Confidential_Declaration_Form1.pdf. The completed form should be handed to the Incumbent or PSO for secure and confidential storage.

A ringer does NOT require a DBS check if acting in a supporting role, undertaking unplanned one-off teaching or deputising in an emergency, providing two adults (preferably one of each gender) are present, nor for transporting children or vulnerable adults as part of arrangements between families.

Where there is cause for concern this should be reported to the Parish Safeguarding Officer or Incumbent immediately.³

- 1 The Parish Safeguarding Statement / Policy should be displayed in the church together with the name and contact details of the Parish Safeguarding Officer.
 - 2 The PSO, Parish Safeguarding Officer, will keep a register of C2 courses attended but ringers are advised to keep their own record too to ensure that their qualifications do not lapse.
 - 3 The Parish Safeguarding Officer or Incumbent will refer immediately to Suffolk County Council Customer First – 0808 800 4005.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers

Objects, Constitution and Rules - 2017 revision

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

- 1 Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
- 2 Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
- 3 Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
- 4 Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
- 5 Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of bells and their fittings.
- 6 Supporting restoration and / or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

- 1 The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref. 266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

- 2 Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A Person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside of the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
- 3 Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
- 4 Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a Ringing Member aged between 70 and 79

C. DISTRICTS

- 5 There shall be four Districts, North East, North West, South East and South West. Towers may move from one District to another with the agreement of both Districts and subject to approval by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
- 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.
- 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.

7 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the GMC. At any AGM or SGM a quorum shall be 5% of members eligible to vote.

8 Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

Librarian	Secretary	Handbells Trustee

Report Editor	Magazine Editor	Public Relations Officer
Webmaster	Mini Ring Trustee	Central Council Reps

9 The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts.

10 The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment. The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of all Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

11 All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.

12 All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.

12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.

13 The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.

14 The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.

15 Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC, but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Advisor. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.

16 The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.

17 The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.

18 The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.

19 The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.

20 The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.

21 The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.

- 22 The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

- 23 All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
- 24 The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the Guild and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets.
- 25 The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

- 26 The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
- 26.1 Fourteen days notice of any proposed change to the Constitution and Rules of the Guild must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and the Guild website.
- 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
- 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
- 27 In the event of dissolution of the Guild, any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild, but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 1 Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
- 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
- 2 Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed, the existing rate shall continue.
- 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
- 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
- 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 70 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 80 years of age shall pay no subscription.
- 3 Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM after their nomination has been approved by the GMC. No further subscription is payable after election.
- 4 Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5.1 Any person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.

- 5.2 Any Non-Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese. The person may become a Ringing Member, without re-election, provided that the person was previously elected as a Ringing Member. The person must then pay the appropriate subscription.
- 6 For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
- 7 Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 8 All Officers shall retire at the Guild’s AGM, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received, election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

- 9 The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of the Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee, and up to five members from each District, elected in accordance with Rule 20.
- 9.1 Nine members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
- 10 The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two members from each District.
- 11 The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
- 12 Each Committee in Rules 9, 10 and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
- 13 The Guild Executive shall consist of:

Guild Chairman	Ringing Master	Secretary
Treasurer	Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee.	

The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
- 14 The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
- 15 The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

- 16 The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
- The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District).
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

- 17 All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
- 18 Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
- a) The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - b) The appropriate peal fees.
 - c) Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

M. DISTRICT RULES

- 19 Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
- 20 The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary/Treasurer, Magazine Correspondent, two members to serve on the RTC and up to five members to serve on the GMC.
- 20.1 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 20.2 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the Annual District Meeting on the year's work.
- 21 The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
- Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
- 22 The District Magazine Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Magazine, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

- 1 The Suffolk Guild handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of four sets of handbells:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.

- 2 The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by other member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
- 3 The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them, until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of the Trustee.
- 4 The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
- 5 If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
- 6 The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
- 7 The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that Committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITION RULES:

- 1 The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
- 2 All Ringing Members and Life honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
- 3 The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:
Mitson Shield and Lester Brett Trophy
- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - a) at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
 - b) The ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2
 - a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
 - b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. Marked changes start when the first change is made.

Rose Trophy

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a District or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
- 4 Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
- 5 The times of the draws are to be advertised in the Ringing World and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
- 6 A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
- 7 In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples, a cover bell must be used.
- 8 The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
- 9 In the event of a large entry, the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
- 10 A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
- 11 A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
- 12 The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
- 13 Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
