The challenge for this year will be to arrange for people who rang their first quarter peal last year to ring their second.

## 7. Any Other Business

PJG drew Members' attention to the Council Review Action Group (CRAG) Report, which was commissioned by the Central Council for Bell Ringing (CCBR). The report makes proposals to 'return ringing to ordinary ringers' and considers that the role of the CCBR may have lost relevance. PJG urged Members to read the CRAG report and let our GMC representatives know any views. We need to establish a consensus before the GMC meeting on 29 May.

MC warmly thanked Martin Fowler and the band at Metfield for making the bells available and for the use of the Village Hall, which is an excellent facility.
